

## Dave Jones Bar: Beer tasting notes

BREWER	NAME	ABV	DESCRIPTION
Church End Warwickshire	Fallen Angel	5%	A sharp, full flavoured pale bitter. Bucket full of American hops, give it that lemony edge.
Holden's Dudley	Black Country Special	5.1%	An amber premium beer with robust malty overtones and a bitter sweet full bodied taste.
Ludlow Ludlow	Stairway	5%	A golden ale, honey gold in colour, a grassy, citrus, floral smell, and a sharp, sweet, full bodied flavour .
Sarah Hughes Dudley	Surprise	5%	Bitter sweet, medium bodied, hoppy ale with some malt.
Three Tuns Shropshire	Clerics Cure	5%	A light-tan beer presenting medium malty-sweetness with powerful, spicy, floral bitterness and hop character designed to re-create the iconic style of India Pale Ales of the 19 <sup>th</sup> . Century.
Three Tuns Shropshire	Old Scrooge	6.5%	A rich, dark and fiery, yet smooth, barley wine with flavours of liquorice, ginger, caramel and roasted malts lasting through into a strongly bitter finish.

### Traditional Cider

BREWER	NAME	ABV	DESCRIPTION
Barkers of Hallow Worcester	Perry	6%	A small traditional brewery just outside of Worcester.
Barkers of Hallow Worcetser	Medium Dry	7.1%	Made with apples from their own traditional cider orchards North of Worcester.
Moles Somerset	Black Rat	4.7%	A strong dry premium blend cider full of flavour with a clean apple bite.
Thatcher's Somerset	Heritage	4.9%	A popular, traditional cider - it really looks and tastes like a 'proper cider' but you'll find its light touch and balanced flavors offer a drink that appeals to all comers
Thatcher's Somerset	Cheddar Valley	6%	Unique and vibrant with a character all of its own.
Thatcher's Somerset	Traditional Dry	6%	Produced from a blend of English home grown apples, it will appeal to those who like Somerset cider.
The Fleece Inn Evesham	The Ark	6%	Verging on dry with a crisp taste of the cider apples from which is was made collected from the Malvern hills area. Made by the landlord at the Fleece Inn.
Gwynt Y DDraig Wales	Two Trees Perry	4.5%	A pale, fruity perry with an aroma of fruit and a hint of honey on the palate.

### Mild

BREWERS	NAME	ABV	DESCRIPTION
Church End Warwickshire	Grave diggers	3.8%	Dark black and red in colour, with a complex mixture of chocolate and roast flavours. The use of two different hops, gives the beer a complex feel and smooth finish.
Enville Stoubridge	Nailmaker Mild	4%	With a more defined hop aroma and higher gravity than its counterpart this mild enjoys a certain degree of sweetness associated with traditional mild yet gives a drier finish.
Hook Norton Oxfordshire	Hooky Dark	3.2%	A dark chestnut coloured ale, full of roast malt flavours, and complemented with superb dry-hop aromas from East Kent Goldings.
Sarah Hughes Dudley	Dark Ruby Mild	6.0%	A beer from a less well known mild tradition for strength with soft flavours and gentle hops. Mashed with 100% mild ale spring barley malt and then with Golding hops in the copper give the restrained bitterness.

### Cask Ales – Bitter <4%

BREWERS	NAME	ABV	DESCRIPTION
Church End Warwickshire	Goats Milk	3.8%	Golden yellow nectar. Pale barley, crystal malt and oats, blend to fill the palate with flavour. Aromatic hops dance over the tongue for a gentle hop finish.
Hook Norton Oxfordshire	Best Bitter	3.6%	A subtly balanced, golden bitter, hoppy to the nose, malty on the palate - the classic session beer, eminently drinkable.
Malvern Hills Malvern	Feel Good	3.8%	A light frothy beer that lives up to its name, with a floral spicy aroma and good bittering quality.
Teme Valley Knightwick	This	3.7%	A light frothy beer that lives up to its name, with a floral spicy aroma and good bittering quality.
Wye Valley Herefordshire	Bitter	3.7%	Delicate hoppy aroma leading on to a full malty flavour and ending in a crisp, clean bitter finish.

**Cask Ales – Best Bitter 4- 4.5%**

BREWERS	NAME	Abv	DESCRIPTION
Church End Warwickshire	What the foxes hat	4.2%	A full golden coloured beer with a soft hop flavour and finish.
Church End Warwickshire	Hop Gun	4.1%	Green Bullet hops make this a very distinctive, bitter pale ale. Yellow in colour, with clean bitter hop flavours.
Church End Warwickshire	Vicars Ruin	4.4%	This is our straw coloured best bitter. Delightful hop flavours soften to a delicate malt finish.
Hook Norton Oxfordshire	Gold	4.1%	A very pale, crisp beer, confidently displaying its hop character. The first Hook Norton beer to feature American hops. A fruity aroma and a pleasant, light taste.
Ludlow Ludlow	Black Knight	4.5%	A ruby black stout with a slightly sweet, roasted, nutty flavour
Ludlow Ludlow	Gold	4.2%	Our first brew, this is a golden drink in the tradition of well-hopped ales. Pale hue, Maris Otter pale malt, Fuggles & Goldings hops. Dry elongated bitter aftertaste.
Malvern Hills Malvern	Swedish Nightingale	4%	A light hoppy beer that imparts a floral nose leading to citrus flavours
Malvern Hills Malvern	Green Pear	4.4%	Finest Herefordshire Green Hops are added to the traditional Black Pear recipe giving a fuller hoppy note along with a pleasant aroma and bitter finish
Malvern Hills Malvern	Black Pear	4.4%	A citrus hoppiness is the main constituent of this golden brew but has a long, dry aftertaste. <i>Always a great Fleece favourite!</i>
Olde Swan Dudley	Dark Swan	4.2%	Smooth, sweet, dark, mild with late roast malt in the finish.
Teme Valley Knightwick	Talbot Blond	4.4%	A smooth, rich, pale beer.

Teme Valley Knightwick	Hop Neuvelle	4.1%	Exceptionally pale. Brewed with un-kilned hops less than an hour after harvest. Dry and hoppy.
Teme Valley Knightwick	That	4.1%	A rich fruity nose and a wide range of hoppy and multi – flavours in the copper coloured best bitter.
Three Tuns Shropshire	XXX	4.3%	A pale, sweetish bitter with a light hop aftertaste that has a honey finish. <i>Another personal favourite.</i>
Three Tuns Shropshire	Stout	4.4%	Black, silky-smooth, creamy, old-fashioned stout with a tight, foamy head and effusive caramel and burnt, roasted flavours, carrying to a long spicy, bitter finish.
Wood Shropshire	Parish	4%	A blend of malt and hops with a bitter aftertaste. Pale brown in colour.
Wood Shropshire	Shropshire Lass	4.1%	Golden ale with a zesty bitterness.
Wood Shropshire	Shropshire Lad	4.5%	A strong, well rounded bitter, drawing flavour from a fine blend of selected English malted barley and Fuggles and Golding hops.
Wood Shropshire	Woodcutter	4.2%	Copper, Spicy and slightly fruity aroma. Traditional English Hops. Roasted malt on the pallet followed by a clear finish.
Wye Valley Herefordshire	HPA	4%	With Maris Otter pale malt and malted wheat also being used, this is very much a pale ale with all the right ingredients
Wye Valley Herefordshire	Butty Bach	4.5%	Brewed using Maris Otter and Crystal malts, flaked barley, malted wheat, and locally grown Fuggles, Goldings and Bramling Cross hops.
Wye Valley Herefordshire	Golden	4.2%	<i>A burnished gold, full-bodied premium ale.</i>

**Cask Ales - best Bitter 4.6 – 5%**

BREWERS	NAME	ABV	DESCRIPTION
Hook Norton Oxfordshire	Old Hooky	4.6%	A beautifully balanced beer, fruity by nature, with a well-rounded body and the suggestive echo of Crystal Malt.
Ludlow Ludlow	Boiling Well	4.7%	Our second brew. Uses Marris Otter pale malt, Fuggles & Goldings hops, but we add a bit of crystal malt, which provides a maltier flavour and a darker hue.
